## STOCKPORT.

---

STOCKPORT, with the township of HEATON NORRIS (so far as the limits of Stockport borough extend) and the hamlets of PORTWOOD, EDGELEY, and BRINKSWAY.

STOCKPORT is a large parish on the borders of Lancashire, including the townships of BRAMALL, BREDBURY, BRINNINGTON, HYDE, MARPLE, NORBURY, OFFERTON, ROMILEY or CHADKIRK, STOCKPORT, STOCKPORT ETCHHELLS, TORRINGTON, and WERNETH, in the union to which it gives its name; DUKINFIELD, with part of the borough of STALEY-BRIDGE, in the union of Ashton-under-Lyne, in Lancashire, and DISLEY-STANLEY, in Hayfield union, Derbyshire, containing altogether, by the census of 1861, 98,005 inhabitants, and 25,175 acres.

Stockport is an extensive manufacturing township, borough, and market town, in Stockport union, containing, by the census of 1861, 30,746 inhabitants, and 1740 acres; in the hundred and deanery of Macclesfield, diocese and archdeaconry of Chester, North Cheshire, 6 miles south-east from Manchester, 46 north-east from Chester, 11½ from Macclesfield, 25½ from Crewe, and 182½ from London. This place, although not mentioned in Domesday survey, is considered to be very ancient, and formerly a Roman station, but from what source the name of the town is derived is somewhat doubtful, ancient historians having spelt it *Stoppport*, *Stopworth*, and *Stopsford*, at different periods. The Mersey runs through the town, dividing it from the hamlet of Heaton Norris, Lancashire, and is crossed on the Manchester road by a handsome bridge of eleven arches. The original grant for a market at Stockport appears to have been about the year 1260. The market-day is on Friday, but in consequence of the great increase of population, an extensive provision market is also held on Saturday. There are cattle fairs on the 1st January, the 4th and 25th March, the 1st and 25th May, the 23rd and 24th October in each year. Previously to the passing of the Municipal Corporation Act, 1835, Stockport, having been

anciently incorporated, was governed by a mayor and corporation, but by this act the borough was placed under the jurisdiction of a mayor, 14 aldermen, and 12 common councillors, with a commission of the peace, for the appointment of borough magistrates.

The town has considerably improved during the last quarter of a century, and numerous and extensive cotton manufactories have been erected in and around Stockport, to meet the requirements of the increase in the cotton trade, which has long been the staple trade of the town. Stockport is the centre of a large manufacturing district, and participated largely in the prosperity of the neighbouring city of Manchester up to the recent cotton famine, since which time, it, with other cotton manufacturing towns, has suffered greatly from the depression in trade. The ground on which Stockport is built is singularly uneven and irregular, and the approaches to the Market Place are circuitous and difficult for strangers to find, and it cannot be reached from any side (except Churchgate) without mounting a formidable hill; but it is proposed to erect a high level bridge, connecting it with St. Peter's gate and the Wellington road, so as to make the entrance from that part of the town more available for general traffic. It is covered with a glass roof placed upon iron pillars, thus affording partial protection from the weather for the various parties attending the market.

The London and North Western Railway intersects the town, and passes over a magnificent viaduct of twenty-two arches, at a height of 108 feet above the bed of the river. A new line is also in the course of formation to Timperley, being an extension of the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire line from Hyde, which will afford a much more direct communication with Liverpool and other parts of Lancashire than the present route through Manchester.

The MOTHER CHURCH, dedicated to St. Mary, is a handsome Gothic edifice, on the east side of the Market Place, which was re-built in 1817, and consists of nave, chancel, and side aisles, with a noble tower, containing a peal of eight bells. The chancel was rebuilt in 1848, and the church then underwent a thorough renovation. The living is a rectory, valued at £1882 per annum, in the incumbency of the Rev. Charles Kenrick Prescott, M.A., and the patronage of Lord Vernon. The rectory house is situate on an extensive eminence in Church-gate, commanding some magnificent views of the town and neighbourhood.

The CHURCH of St. PETER is a plain building, in St. Peter's square, which was erected in 1768, by William Wright, Esq. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the incumbency of the Rev. Henry Creswell, valued at £220 per annum, and in the patronage of the Rev. H. Wright. The Rev. John Meredith is the officiating minister.

St. THOMAS'S CHURCH, between Wellington road, south, and Hill gate, is a handsome edifice in the Grecian style, surmounted by a cupola; it was opened in 1825. The living is a perpetual curacy, valued at £110 per annum, with residence, in the incumbency of the Rev. Joseph Taylor, M.A., and the patronage of Lord Vernon, and on the next vacancy of the rectory of Stockport, a portion of that living will be added thereto.

STOCKPORT GREAT MOOR CHURCH is a plain brick building in the Gothic style, which was erected in 1852. The living, in the incumbency of the Rev. J. Coombes, is a perpetual curacy, valued at £80 per annum, in the patronage of J. Marriott, Esq.

The CATHOLIC CHURCH, dedicated to St. Joseph, situate in St. Peter's gate, is a handsome Gothic edifice, 103 feet long, and 70 feet high, containing an apse, nave, and two aisles, with vestry for the priests, and also one for the acolytes. It is not thoroughly finished, but reflects great credit upon the architect, M. E. Hadfield, Esq., of Sheffield. It was opened for divine service on the 25th June, 1862. It contains a magnificent, rich-toned organ, which was built by Messrs. Gray and Davidson, of London. There are excellent schools for children of both sexes and infants, with teachers' residences attached, in connection with the above church, which have been very highly spoken of by the Government inspector.

The Wesleyans have a noble chapel in Tiviotdale, capable of accommodating 2500 people, and another in Hill gate.

The Independents, Unitarians, Baptists, Society of Friends, and Association Methodists have each of them places of worship here.

There is a Free Grammar School, which was found by Sir Edward Shaa, in 1447, who also endowed it with £10 per annum. The Grammar School, in the Wellington road, which was built by the Goldsmiths' Company, in 1831, with residences for the masters, forms a handsome group of buildings. Fifty scholars are instructed free of expense, and the remainder pay a capitation fee of £1 1s. 0d. per quarter, which goes into the hands of the Goldsmiths' Company, who pay the salaries of the various masters. There are a great quantity of schools in various parts of Stockport, including National, British, and numerous Sunday Schools, in connection with every denomination of religionists, affording to all classes the means of a good education at a very moderate rate.

The MECHANICS' INSTITUTION, LIBRARY, and READING ROOMS is a noble building, in Wellington road, south, and is abundantly supplied with nearly all the papers and periodicals of the present time.

The RIFLE VOLUNTEERS' BARRACKS is a handsome building in Greek street, which was erected in 1861; it contains an excellent drill shed, 60 yards long by 25 wide, with dépôt for arms, to which is also attached an excellent library and reading room, for the use of the volunteers, supplied with the principal papers and periodicals of the day.

The VERNON PARK, which is entered from Churchgate and Turncroft lane on the one side, and New Bridge lane on the other, is about half a mile from the Market Place. Some splendid views are obtained from the elevated portions, and it affords a healthy and pleasing recreation ground for the public generally.

HEATON NORRIS is an extensive suburb of Stockport, on the north side of the Mersey, the greater portion of which is included in the borough of Stockport; it is in the parish of Manchester, Stockport union, and contains, by the census of 1861, 16,333 inhabitants, and 2108 acres, in the hundred of Salford, diocese of Manchester, archbishopric of York, South Lancashire. The living is a rectory, in the incumbency of the Rev. Charles Babington, M.A., and the patronage of the Bishop of Manchester. The Church, dedicated to Our Saviour, is a handsome cruciform edifice, in Wellington Road, north, which was erected in 1846; it is in the early English style of architecture, surmounted by a lofty spire, containing a clock with three dials.

PORTWOOD is a hamlet and suburb of Stockport, adjoining thereto on the east, but is part of the township of Brinnington, and is included in the census returns for that township. The Church, dedicated to St. Paul, which was opened for divine service in 1851, is a fine Gothic edifice, with a handsome spire and one bell. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the incumbency of the Rev. Jeremiah Coombes, and in the alternate patronage of the Crown and the Bishop of Chester. The Wesleyan Brunswick chapel is situated here, and there are excellent schools in connection with that denomination, for children of both sexes and infants. The Wesleyan New Connexion have also a place of worship here. There are several extensive cotton factories in this suburb. The Portwood News Room, at the corner of John street and Brewery street, was formerly a Wesleyan school, and was purchased by, and fitted up at the expense of, Edward Carrington Howard, Esq., in 1861, who has kindly presented it to the public, and is still its principal supporter. The library contains upwards of 800 volumes, and the reading room is supplied with all the leading papers and periodicals; in addition to which there is a splendid lecture room, also a smoking room, and a skittle alley; it being the desire of the honourable donor to provide the neighbourhood with the means of rational and useful amusement, at a cost quite within the reach of every working man or woman, the entrance fee being only 6d. for every man above 18, under 18, 2d.; for females 2d.; and a weekly subscription of one penny from each.

EDGELEY is a suburb, adjoining to, and on the west side of, Stockport, in the township of Cheadle Moseley, and is included in the census returns of that place. The Church, dedicated to Saint Matthew, is a handsome building, which was erected in 1855-6, and contains nave, chancel, and side aisles. The living is a perpetual curacy, valued at £160 per annum, in the incumbency of the Rev. John Willington, B.A., and the patronage of the Crown and Bishop of Chester alternately. The Roman Catholics have a place of worship here.

BRINKSWAY is a suburb of Stockport, adjoining Edgeley, also in the township of Cheadle Moseley.

**BRAMHALL**, or **BRAMALL**, formerly **BROMHALL**, is a township in Stockport parish and union, containing, by the census of 1861, 1615 inhabitants, and 3250 acres; 3 miles south from Stockport. The ancient hall, the seat of Lieutenant-Colonel William Davenport, J.P., (who is lord of the manor) is a peculiar structure of timber and plaster, painted black and white, some parts of which appear to have been built as early as the reign of Edward IV. The Domestic Chapel, at the south end, is supposed to have been added about the time of Richard III. The London and North Western Railway to Macclesfield passes through the lordship, and has a station at Pownall Green.

**HAZEL GROVE**, originally called **BULLOCK SMITHY**, is a hamlet of Bramhall, but is situated in the several townships of Bramhall, Bosden, Norbury, and Torkington, 3 miles south from Stockport. There are four silk throwing mills and a cotton factory in the hamlet. The Independents and Wesleyans have each places of worship here

BREDBURY is a township in Stockport parish and union, containing, by the census of 1861, 3408 inhabitants, and 2521 acres; in the hundred and deanery of Macclesfield, archdeaconry and diocese of Chester, North Cheshire; 2½ miles north-east from Stockport. The living is a perpetual curacy, valued at £243 per annum, in the incumbency of the Rev. James Whittaker, B.A., and the patronage of the Crown and the Bishop of Chester alternately. The Church, dedicated to Saint Mark, was erected in 1848, and is a handsome edifice in the early English style, consisting of nave, chancel, and aisles, with a tower, surmounted by pinnacles. It is calculated to seat 862 persons, of which 520 are free. There is a good National School close to the church. The Independents and Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists have places of worship here. There are several collieries in the neighbourhood, which produce but an inferior coal, it being mostly used for engines. There are some charitable bequests for the benefit of the poor. J. Howard, Esq., is lord of the manor.

DISLEY-STANLEY is a township of Stockport parish, in Hayfield union, Derbyshire,  
containing, by the census of 1861, 2265 inhabitants, and 2700 acres; in the hundred and  
deanery of Macclesfield, archdeaconry and diocese of Chester, North Cheshire, 6½ miles  
south-east from Stockport, on the Buxton branch of the London and North Western  
Railway, at which it has two stations, one at Disley and another at New Mills. The  
living is a perpetual curacy, in the incumbency of the Rev. Charles James Satterthwaite,  
M.A., and the patronage of the vicar of Stockport, annual value £120. The Church is a

## DUKINFIELD.

DUKINFIELD, or DUCKENFIELD, is a large manufacturing township in Stockport parish, union of Ashton-under-Lyne, Lancashire, a great portion of which is included in the borough of Stalybridge; the census return in 1861 being as follows:—Dukinfeld township, 15,024 inhabitants; Stalybridge part of borough, 14,929 inhabitants; total, 29,953 inhabitants, and 1690 acres of land. It is in the hundred and deanery of Macclesfield, archdeaconry and diocese of Chester, North Cheshire; 6½ miles north-east from Stockport, 6 east from Manchester, and 185 from London. The Peak Forest Canal, and the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway, pass through the township. It is a place of very ancient date, and was called by the Saxons *Dockenvelldt*, and formed the boundary of the original kingdoms of Northumbria and Mercia, in the Saxon heptarchy, and both sides of the stream were considerably fortified by each party. Colonel Robert Dukinfeld, who was then owner of this manor, from whence he took his name, was a noted officer of Cromwell's army, and was a member of the infamous court-martial at Chester, which sentenced the Earl of Derby to death, and it is stated that Henry Bradshaw, having obtained a pardon for the Earl, placed it in the hands of Colonel Dukinfeld, who suppressed it. Dukinfeld was but an inconsiderable agricultural village until the past half century, and in 1801 the population was only 1737; but, like its neighbours
