The parish consists of the chapels of DISLEY, STANLEY, DUKINFIELD, HYDE MARPLE, NORBURY, ROMILY or CHADKIRK, with the townships of BRANMALL, BREDBURY, BRINNINGTON, ETCHILLS, OFFERTON, TORKINGTON, and WERNETH. The population of Stockport township, in 1851, was 30,589, and the acreage 1,740; the population of the borough was 53,835. The corporation consists of a mayor, borough magistrates, aldermen, and councillors. The magistrates' sittings are held at the Court-house on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday. Petty sessions are held every alternate Thursday. There is a County Court. The Board of Guardians meet on Monday. The town is situated on the river Mersey, on the summit of a steep hill, and is most irregularly built, in some parts precipitous, with an ascent from the north; around this acclivity on the south bank of the river the houses rise in successive

amphitheatrical tiers from the base to the summit, in a romantic form, and the scenery is picturesque. Here are breweries, foundries, machine works, and flour mills, but the staple trade of the town is the spinning and manufacture of cotton. The buildings are of great height, rising to six, seven, and eight stories, erected at an expense of many thousand pounds. The capital sunk in a single mill often exceeds £100,000. The town is well supplied with water on constant pressure, and lighted with gas.

Among the most recent improvements is the widening of Cheapside-corner and Bridge-street; and Edgeley has been sewered, and is now well-drained. The greatest of the improvements is the Wellington-road; it extends from Heaton church to Rowcroft Smithy, and avoids all the narrow and precipitous ascents and declivities of the town, and crosses the Mersey without descending from the high grounds on either side of the vale of that river; this was effected by the construction of a fine bridge of eleven arches across the valley and the river—nine of the arches are on the Cheshire, and two on the Lancashire side of the Mersey; it was opened to the public in 1826; the whole was completed in less than two years, at an expense of £40,000. The principal object of interest in the neighbourhood is the magnificent viaduct of the Manchester and Birmingham branch of the London and North Western railway, which literally passes over the town, and the extreme length of which is 1,780 feet; it has 22 semicircular arches, each 63 feet span, and carries two lines of rails; its height to the surface of the rails is 108 feet from the bed of the river; the cost was about £75,000, a saving of £50,000 having been effected in the whole line to Manchester by increasing the altitude of the viaduct to the present plan.

The market day is on Friday, chiefly for agricultural produce, but a more considerable trade is done on Saturday. The fairs are held on the 4th and 25th March for cattle; 1st January and 4th July for general agricultural stock; 20th and 25th October for cattle, and likewise pleasure fair. Here is a Mechanics' Institution and Reading-rooms for all classes.

The church of St. Mary (the mother church), is of stone, and was rebuilt (except the chancel) in the year 1817, at an expense of £30,000; it consists of nave, chancel, aisles, organ, font, clock, and a lofty square embattled tower, surmounted by pinnacles, with a fine ring of 8 bells; the great east window is a fine piece of architectural tracery and elaborate chiselling, and is justly considered as a fine specimen of decorated workmanship of the 14th century. The living is a rectory, worth £2,700, with residence, in the gift of Lord Vernon; the Rev. Charles Kenrick Prescott, M.A., is the rector, and the Rev. Richard Dawson, M.A., is the curate. St. Thomas's church is a handsome structure, on the east side of the Wellington-road, finished in 1825 at a cost of £16,000, in the Grecian style of architecture, with a tower surmounted by a cupola. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of Lord Vernon. On the next avoidance of the rectory of Stockport, the living will become a separate rectory; the Rev. Joseph Taylor, M.A., is the incumbent. Christ church, Heaton Norris, is a handsome building, on the east side of Wellington-street north, of a cruciform structure, in the Early English style, with a lofty spire, finished by a clock and three dials, built in 1846, at a cost of £6,000. It is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the Bishop of Manchester; the Rev. J. B. Jeaffreson is the incumbent. St. Peter's church is a brick building of simple construction, situate in St. Peter's-square, and erected in 1768, at the sole expense of William Wright, Esq., who endowed it with £120 per annum. The living is a perpetual curacy, which was augmented with £200 benefaction and £200 Queen Anne's Bounty, and of £57 per annum for repairs; Rev. John Merdithy is the curate. St. Paul's, Portwood, is a new stone building of modern architecture, surmounted by a very handsome lofty spire; the Rev. James Gillies is the incumbent. Here are chapels for Wesleyans, Independents, Catholics, Unitarians, Baptists, Quakers, and Primitive Methodists. There are schools on the National system attached to the churches of St. Thomas's, St. Peter's, and Christchurch. There is a Free Grammar school, founded by Sir Edmund Shaa, or Shaw, of London, in 1487, and endowed with £10 per annum. The National school in Wellington-road south, is a fine brick building, erected in 1826 at a cost of upwards of £6,000. The British school is a neat structure, in the Wellington-road south: the site was given by Lord Vernon. The Stockport Sunday school, situated in Duke-street, is a noble structure of brick, four stories high, founded for the education and religious instruction of the children of the laboring poor of the town of Stockport and the neighbourhood. A new Market-house has been erected in the market-place, but is little used. The Court-house is used for the Town Hall and lock-up. The Union-house is a fine building, erected for 700 inmates (the

average number being 400), standing at Shaw-heath. There is likewise a county lock-up. The Infirmary, situate in the Wellington-road south, is a handsome structure of brick, fronted with freestone, 100 feet in length, erected in 1832 at a cost of nearly £6,000, and has an accommodation for 50 in-patients. The fever wards are separated from every other part of the building. The Savings bank, which was established in 1824, is held in the Hillgate.

BREDBURY is a township, ecclesiastical district, and village, 2½ miles north-east-by-north from Stockport. The church of St. Mark is a handsome building in the Early English style, and consists of nave, chancel, and aisles, with tower surmounted by pinnacles. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of the Crown and Bishop alternately. There is a school attached to the church. The Independents have a chapel here. Harry Town Hall is the seat of Joshua Bruckshaw, Esq. High Field House is the seat of James Ashton, Esq. Bredbury Hall is the seat of Nicholas Heald, Esq. The population, in 1851, was 2,991, and the acreage, 2,521. It is in Stockport parish and union.

DISLEY is a township and village 6½ miles south-east from Stockport, in Stockport parish, hundred of Macclesfield, Hayfield union, Chester bishopric, York archbishopric, North Cheshire division, and is situated on the high road from Manchester to Buxton, in Derbyshire. The church of All Saints is an old stone building in the Gothic style, with square embattled tower, pinnacles, and containing 6 bells; has a nave, three aisles, chancel, font, and organ; the eastern window is of stained glass; the living is a perpetual curacy, value £117, in the gift of Thomas Legh, Esq. The Rev. Noble Wilson, M.A., is the incumbent. There is a National and Day school for boys and girls, also a Sunday school held at the above school-room. There is also a Day and Sunday school for Wesleyans. The County Police have a station here. The population, in 1851, was 2,225, and the acreage is 2,523a. 0r. 1p. The soil is clayey and sandy; the subsoil is mostly rock. Thomas Legh, Esq., is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley, and potatoes. There are charities of £5 yearly value.

FURNACE is a hamlet in the township of Disley and parish of Stockport, on the high road to Buxton, and 1 mile westward from Whaley. It consists of a few houses and shops on the roadside.

HANDFORTH, or HANDFORTH-CUM-BOSDEN, is a township and railway station in the parish and union of Stockport, 17½ miles from London, 7½ from Birmingham, 20½ from Crewe, 4½ from Chester, 10½ from Manchester, 5 south-west from Stockport, 15½ from Sandbach, 45 from Stafford. There is a chapel of ease and a National school. Here are the extensive calico print works of Messrs. Symonds, Cuuliffe, and Co. Handforth Hall, formerly the residence of the Breretons, is about a quarter of a mile from the church, and is now occupied as a farmhouse. The population, in 1851, was 2,671, for the township, and the acreage, 1,781; the population of the hamlet of Handforth is 650.

BOSDEN is a hamlet 2½ miles south-south-east from Stockport, and 5 from Handforth, being severed from the rest of the township by the township of Bramhall intervening. For the residents of Bosden see Bramhall and Hazel Grove. The population of the hamlet of Bosden is 2,021.

HEATON NORRIS is a part of the borough of Stockport, being a township in Manchester parish, Salford hundred, Stockport union, Manchester bishopric, York archbishopric, South Lancashire. Its population, in 1851, was 15,697, whereof 13,660 were within the borough. The ecclesiastical district of Heaton Norris, constituted 14th September, 1848, contained in 1851 a population of 17,835.

NORBURY is a township, ecclesiastical district, and village, 3 miles south from Stockport, and 9 east from Macclesfield, in Stockport parish and union, Macclesfield hundred and deanery, Chester archdeaconry, York archbishopric, and north division of Cheshire; it is situated on the Stockport, Disley and Whaleybridge railway. The church of St. Thomas is a new stone building in the Gothic style; it has a nave, aisles, organ, low tower, 6 bells, font, clock, and the east window is painted. The living is a curacy, worth £120 yearly, with 9 acres of glebe land, in the gift of Thomas Legh, Esq., of Lyme Park; the Rev. William Worsley, B.A., is the incumbent. There is a National school for boys and girls, and a Sunday school is held in the school-room. There are collieries here. The population, in 1851, was 848, and the acreage is 1,410. The soil is clayey and sandy; the subsoil gravel and clay. Thomas Lee, Esq., is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The chief crops are wheat, oats, and potatoes.

OFFERTON is a small township and village 2 miles south-east from Stockport, in Stockport parish and union, North

Cheshire. The soil is mostly clay, with a portion of sand. The Wesleyans have a chapel here. The population, in 1851, was 352, and the acreage 730.

ROMILEY or CHADKIRK chapelry is a scattered village 4 miles east-by-north from Stockport, in Stockport parish and union, Macclesfield hundred and deanery, Chester archdeaconry and bishopric, North Cheshire. The river Etherow has its confluence with the Goyt about 200 yards below Compstall bridge, and thence takes the name of the Mersey. Here are two cotton mills and an extensive print works. Oakwood Hall is the seat of Mrs. Heyworth. The Wesleyans have a

small chapel here. Chadkirk chapel is a low antique structure, consisting of nave and chancel, with a belfry. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of the Rector of Stockport. The population, in 1851, was 1,364, and the acreage 2,290.

NO MAN'S LAND is an extra-parochial place, with a population of 34 in 1851.

TORKINGTON is a small township in the parish and union of Stockport, 3 miles south-east from thence; it contained, in 1851, a population of 358, and 820 acres.

BRAMHALL, or **BRAMALL**, is a considerable township in the parish of Stockport. The soil is mostly stiff clay, with about one-third under the plough. Bramhall Hall, the seat of Lieut.-Col. Davenport, is a fine old mansion of timber and plaster, painted black and white, and is picturesquely situated on the knoll of a hill, at the foot of which runs a small rivulet. This is one of the most remarkable mansions in England, and many parts of the interior are very ancient. The Macclesfield branch of the London and North Western railway intersects the township, and has a

station at **POWNALL GREEN**. The population, in 1851, was 1,508, and the acreage 3,250.

HAZEL GROVE, formerly called **BULLOCK SMITHY**, is a populous hamlet of Bramhall, 2 miles south of Stockport, in the several townships of Bramhall, Norbury, Bosden, and Torkington; it is nearly 1 mile in length, and is principally situated in Bramhall and Bosden. The Wesleyans and Independents have chapels here. Here is a cotton factory and a mill for silk throwing.

BRERETON-cum-SMETHWICK is a township, parish, and scattered village, 3 miles north-east from Sandbach, in the Nantwich hundred, Congleton union, archdeaconry and bishopric of Chester, and parliamentary borough of South Cheshire. The church of St. Oswald is a handsome stone building in the later English style, with a tower containing 5 bells; it has a nave, two aisles, chancel, and font; the roof is of handsomely carved oak, and there is an elaborate mural monument to the memory of William Smethwick, Esq. The living is a rectory, annual value £681; the Rev. Edward Royds, M.A., is the incumbent. There are chapels for Wesleyans, Wesleyan New Con-

nexion, and Independents, and there is a school for boys and girls. Brereton Hall, the seat of Aaron Howard, Esq., is a handsome brick building with turrets, and is pleasantly situated. The Duke's Oak, an immense tree, the trunk of which is hollow and capable of holding six persons, is on Duke's Oak farm. The population, in 1851, was 649, and the acreage is 4,501a. 3r. 25p. The soil is clay and sandy. Sir C. P. Shakerley, Bart., and Aaron Howard, Esq., are lords of the manor and chief landowners. The chief crops are potatoes, oats, and wheat. There are charities of £15 yearly value.

SMETHWICK is a joint township with Brereton.
